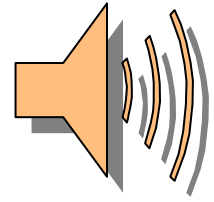

Positive Play ... what is it?

Positive play is a scheme that has been in the news lately – especially at Scargill – where we have had, on Friday 4th April, a cake sale to raise funds for new equipment. It can sometimes, wrongly, be associated with an intervention strategy that is solely used for helping ‘naughty’ or ‘badly behaved’ children. So what is positive play?

Positive Play has been evaluated by a team from Sheffield Hallam university who found that it is an ‘early intervention tool’ that supports children, raises their self-esteem and enables them to access the curriculum allowing them to have a better chance of achieving their full potential. Ofsted have praised the scheme that ‘encourages more inclusive education’.

In it children get to play with an adult either on their own or in small groups so that they can talk freely, learn the rules of playing and sharing and learn to ‘win with humility and lose with dignity’.

It does help children who find that behaviour is an issue but it is also designed to help children who:

need to feel good about themselves and have their self-esteem raised

have missed some early life experiences and need a non-threatening environment to talk and develop

Need help acquiring the complex range of life skills needed to reach their full potential.

The message is clear positive play can help everyone: those with behaviour problems, those who find turn taking a struggle, those who need more confidence or even those who have been through bereavement. It is run by a dedicated team of our Teaching Assistants and co-ordinated by our teachers.

I would encourage all of you, if you are unsure about it in any way, to speak to the class teachers about how positive play has had a positive effect on classroom life every day. It is worth the investment and is definitely something that we will continue to develop at Scargill for the benefit of all children.
