## Prayer and Sensory Garden

You may remember how the courtyard looked a few years ago (completely overgrown and unused) You may well have been one of the many parents who came in over the February half term holiday in 2020 to help us clear it just before the whole country went into lockdown.

Thanks to the generous contribution from Ron Brooks and contributions made to our PTA we have been able to afford to turn this space into our new prayer and sensory garden. A few weeks ago, one of our parents, Mrs Ancliff, and a team of volunteers from Rolls Royce worked tirelessly to give the paving slabs a jet wash, clear weeds, build new seating, planters and an arbour as well as plant lots of bulbs and plants.

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#### Parent Questionnaire

It was great to see so many parents at parents' evening and a huge thank you for giving your feedback through our parent questionnaire. Many parents commented positively about how their children are enjoying their learning at school and the information that they receive.

'It would be nice is communication was better.'



Despite many changes (split years/becoming an academy) Scargill, in my opinion, have always acted with a 'children first' approach and this is why I often recommend Scargill to prospective parents.'

'Still don't like or agree with mix age classes'

'I feel that friendship and bullying type issues should be more of a priority at Scargill.' 'Despite the worries and reservations I had regarding mixed age classes, my child has enjoyed being mixed with the year 4s & has made some new friends. Thank you for making the transition a smooth one.' 'Communication could be better, it can be very last minute and disorganised. 'It would be nice to know how your child is getting on throughout the terms not just at parents evening.' 'My child is very happy at school and Scargill has a lovely, nurturing environment- thank you.'

There are some parents who have said they don't know what their child is learning in school or that we don't teach a wide range of subjects. I can assure you we teach the full National Curriculum and there are overviews of what is taught in each department (2-year cycle) on our website. In addition to this, in the last week of each half term, there is a Department Newsletter which details the learning planned for the following term.

Also, some parents said they were not sure who to go to when needing further information. Below is a chart which will hopefully clarify this for you.



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A few parents said that parents evening was the only time they found out about how their child is doing. In addition to two parents' evenings, three data sheets are shared annually and, as always, you can always ask your child's teacher if there is something you'd particularly like to know.

Some parents expressed concerns about friendships and bullying. We investigate all allegations of bullying and there is a clear process in place regarding this. on our website or ask your child's teacher or a member of the Leadership Team. Next week is Antibullying week. As well as our Friendship Ambassadors leading a special assembly about this on Monday, children will be completing activities based on this year's theme – Reach Out.



As you have probably heard from your chiid, we have become a Class Dojo School. This means children have been earning Dojo points as a reward and their eggs have hatched into little monsters!! We know from our parent questionnaire, that the majority of parents do not want another form of communication at this time but that you would like to see what rewards your children are receiving. So initially, we will only be using Class Dojo to inform you about the Dojo points your child has received. Any other correspondence with teachers will continue in the usual way. If this changes, we will let you know.

Next week, teachers will be sending home a letter which explains how you can connect to your child's classroom community. This will involve giving you a unique code and you can set up your account. This will enable you to receive notifications (if you want to) about the number of points your child has received from their teacher.

Below are some Parent Account FAQ from Dojo. Please note that the Dojo App is free and you will not require any additional subscriptions for use with our school.

*How far back in time can parents see feedback points?* Parents can see the last two weeks of their child's feedback points. Parents also have the option of subscribing to ClassDojo Plus which allows them to see their child(ren)'s all time point history. They can set goals and create customized at home skills which are separate from their school points. Home points and skills and are not visible to their classroom teacher(s).

**When do parents get notified by ClassDojo?** ClassDojo notifies parents if their child(ren) received points during the week, but the parent hasn't logged in recently, they will get a reminder to login and view their child(ren)'s feedback at the end of the week.

According to your responses in the parent questionnaire, many parents don't know what we do to support children's personal development in school. Below is an update from Miss Lang (PSHE Lead) and Miss West (Thrive Practitioner). We will make this a regular feature of newsletters to help you.





Our children have been busy working on their personal development across a range of different subjects. They have been taught the 'Becoming Me' topic in PSHE, where they have been looking at how they are part of their class and the responsibilities they have, both at home and at school. In Thrive, class teachers have also used profiling to discover a suitable target for their class to work on in their Class Thrive time. We have lots of targets across school the school, from learning to being able to say what we need, to how to manage situations when things go wrong. Finally, the children enjoyed Hello Yellow Day before half term and spent the day talking about how to achieve their goals and learning a little bit more from the book, The Butterfly Who Learned to Fly in the Rain. They also thought about their own brain and what kind of 'brain smart' they are. Thank you for supporting us to raise money for such a good cause, as looking after children's mental health is so important for their wellbeing and personal development.
