

There are accounts of Jesus' resurrection in the book of Luke. It says he was seen by some of his followers and close friends and that his tomb was found empty.



What does it mean to Christians?

Belief in Jesus' resurrection confirms to Christians that Jesus is the incarnation of God and that death is not the end. For most Christians the resurrection is a crucial part of their faith, opening up the way for all people to turn to God, repairing the effects of the Fall and bringing salvation. This belief gives Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in a new life (heaven).
