### Lesson 3

WALT Understand what present and past tense means and be able to recognise verbs or sentences in the past or present tense

Is Amelia Earhart alive now? When was she alive? When something has already happened and we talk or write about it, we use something called the past tense. When something is happening now, we call it the present tense. To write a Biography about things that have already happened, we need to use the past tense.


