We realise the challenge of home-learning can be difficult and that the pressure of continuing work as a Critical Worker can be equally challenging. We are very appreciative of the approach and support parents have given to their children to continue to enthuse and keep learning moving forward, especially under what can sometimes be very difficult circumstances. Parents – you have been incredible and we really do appreciate your support.

Feedback about our remote learning has been overwhelmingly positive. Whilst we know there are things we will continue to improve on, we have very much cherished the many messages of appreciation and even some greatly received biscuits and cakes from you, which have kept us all going!

You are all very much in our thoughts and we miss all the children who are remaining at home. It really isn't the same without you! We are hopeful we will be able to welcome everyone back to school very soon. The Government have stated that potentially we will open more widely from 8th March. However, we do not have any more information about this at this time. We will share our plans with you for wider reopening as soon as the Government decide. The Government have said that there will be at least two weeks' notice given to schools prior to all children returning so this will help us to provide a smooth transition. We know there may be worry and concern from parents and children but be assured we will complete the necessary risk assessments and plan a further recovery curriculum to ensure a positive return for all our wonderful children.


