India Link

Mrs Higgins has been in touch with our link school in India throughout this year and, although the situation there is very difficult and schools remain closed, the staff and children are all well. The school has been used as a distribution centre for food and aid to the local area. Alongside providing emergency support needed due to Covid-19, CRS is currently raising funds for a smart phone for each school in Kolkata to enable them to use web-based resources and facilitate the links with the UK teachers more easily. In February, there will be a virtual training event between the UK and India based teachers to continue to support them in their teaching and learning of English.

End of term finish date

As you may well be aware, the Department of Education (DfE) has written to all schools asking them to remain contactable for a six-day window after the end of term so that we can assist with contact tracing where necessary. That means we will need to be available for Test and Trace calls up to and including Christmas Eve and we may then have to contact you if your child is affected.

As a result of this, you may have seen that the press are reporting that we are being allowed to finish a day early and that this is to 'give teachers a proper break'. This is not the case, but merely to avoid what schools have been warning the DfE of for a long time with potential phone calls up to and including Christmas Eve, notifying of positive Covid cases.

If we chose to close early, we would need to either start back early or move one of our other Inset days, which are already planned for including the content of them for staff training. We also think it is not fair to change the dates when we have Christmas activities planned for the children, as well as leaving parents who are working to suddenly find child care. We will therefore NOT be changing our finish date and all children will finish on Friday 18th December as planned.

To help us keep everyone safe, please ensure if your child is unwell or showing any symptoms you do not send them to school, getting them tested as soon as possible if you think they need a test.

As ever, we ask that you email **info@scargill.derbyshire.sch.uk** to notify us of any COVID Tests. This includes over the Christmas period.
