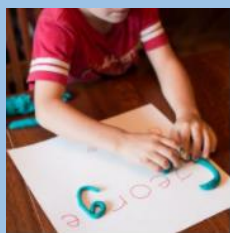


Activities to do with play dough.



Roll out the dough into long worms and then spell out words

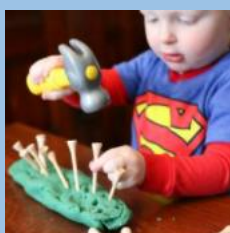


Push different objects into the dough and talk about the textures.

Use the dough to practise counting – how many eggs in the nest, make 6 cupcakes etc



Cut the dough into equal pieces and talk about sharing and halving.



Tap golf tees into the dough, count how many go in, did any fall down?



Create different shapes with the dough and talk about the number of sides and corners each shape has.

Use vehicles to role play a building site, look at the track marks they can make in the dough



Push different objects into the dough and make monsters



Allow your child to use the dough to express their emotions.



Push different plastic insects/dinosaurs etc into the dough and talk about the patterns.

Push different lengths of spaghetti into the dough and compare the length sizes.



Add sprinkles or glitter to the dough to add a bit of glitz and sparkle.



Use a golf tee or a cocktail stick to write letters/numbers in the dough.



Do dough gym, pinch, push, roll, squeeze, squish etc.
