# Rainbow Write

First write each word in pencil.
Then trace over each word three times. Each time you trace, you must use a **DIFFERENT** colour crayon. Trace neatly and maybe you will see a rainbow!

#### Silly Sentences

Write silly sentences using a spelling word in each sentence. Try to make them as funny as you can!

Example: My dog wears a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

#### Hidden Words

Draw and colour a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture.

Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

## Backwards Words

Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Write neatly!

Example: where erehw

# Pyramid Writing

"Pyramid write" your spelling words.

\*Example: home h

ho

hom

home

#### Create an Activity

Can you think of a really fun way to practice your spelling words?

Then go for it!

Be sure to explain your activity to your teacher so that they can share it with the class!

#### ABC Order

First write your spelling words in a list. Then write them in alphabetical ABC order.

For an extra bonus, write your words in reverse ABC order!

# Story, Story

Write a story using ALL of your spelling words. Be sure to underline your spelling words in your paragraph.

Maybe you could make it funny.

#### Draw and Label

Draw and label your spelling words. You MUST colour your drawings and labels.

Don't forget to add a lot of great detail!

# Squiggly Spelling Words

You are going to write your spelling words two times. First write in regular letters. Then write the words again in squiggly letters!

#### Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue coloured pencil.

Trace over the vowels in each word with your blue coloured pencil.

Vowels = a e i o u

#### Bubble Letters

Write your spelling words in bubble letters. After you write your words in bubble letters, colour your words with a crayon or coloured pencil.

#### **Bubble Letters Rock!**

# Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times.

First, write each word in pencil.

Second write each word in crayon.

Third, write each word in felt tip.

#### Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words.
Write an acrostic poem for that word.

You could also illustrate your poem.

\*<u>Example</u>: Fun in the sky.

fly Laps around clouds.

Yes! I'm free!

#### Adding My Words

Each letter has a value.

\*Consonants are worth 10.

\*Vowels are worth 5.

Write your spelling words. Then add up the value of each spelling word.

Example-

said- 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

#### Superman Letter

Your job is to write a creative letter to Superman (or another super hero).

In your letter, you must use each of your spelling words.

#### Spelling Shapes

Count your spelling words. Draw one shape for each word. Then write your spelling words inside each of the shapes.

Examples:

babies



#### Spelling Poem

Write a poem using several of your spelling words. <u>Underline</u> the words that you use. Illustrate your poem.

You can write any type of poem that you like. Enjoy!

## Scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns).

Write your words in the first column.

Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column.

Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

#### Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

## Vowel Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

# upside down

Can you write out your spellings upside down? Maybe lay under a table and see how many you can get correct.

#### Goofy Spelling Story

Write a goofy spelling story using each of your spelling words.

Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.

Illustrate and colour your story!

# Riddle Me

Write a riddle for each of your spelling words. Don't forget to add the answers to your riddles.

\*Example- I cry when I am hungry. I wear nappies. I am cute and cuddly. What am I?

\*Answer- Baby


#### Connect the Dots

Write ten of your spelling words in dots.

Then connect the dots by tracing over them with a coloured pencil.

#### Trace a Shape

Count your spelling words. Draw a shape for each word. Then trace each shape by writing your spelling words around them!



#### 30 Second Words

Write a TV advert using all of your spelling words.

Read it to a parent or sibling and see if they want to buy your product!

## Rhyming Words

Write each of your spelling words.

Next to each word, write a rhyming word. If necessary, your rhyming word can be a nonsense word (as long as it follows the same spelling pattern).

\*Example: cries tries

## Code Words

Come up with a code for each letter of the alphabet. Write down your code.

\*Example: a=



b=



Then write your spelling words in code.

## Fancy Letters

Write each of your spelling words using fancy letters.

Your letters can have curly-q's or dots, for example. Have fun!

## sign Your Words

Use sign language finger spelling to sign the spelling of your words.

#### UPPER and Lower

Write your spelling words two times each.

First, write each word in UPPERCASE letters. Second, write each word in lowercase letters.

\*Example- SLIDE slide

#### Colourful Words

Write each of your spelling words. Write each letter using a different coloured pencil!

\*Example- colourful

#### Across and Down

Write each of your spelling words across and then down (starting with the first letter).

*Examples-	when	four
	h	0
	e	u
	n	r

## 3-D Words

Use Play-Doh or clay to sculpt your spelling words.



Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have a partner read your words as you write them.

Then swap and have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

# secret Agent Words

Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert your words to a number code.

See if your family can crack the code.

# Back Writing

Use your finger to spell out each of your spelling words, one letter at a time, on someone's back.

Then it's YOUR turn to try to FEEL and spell!

#### Spell-er-size!

Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out the letters of your words!

Cheer up high for letters that touch the top handwriting line (ex. t and l), hands on hips for middle letters (ex. a and e), and cheer down low for low letters (Ex. y and j).

## Choo-Choo Words


Write the entire list end-to-end as one long word (like a train). Use a different coloured crayon for each word.

# oots Game

Make a square of 4 rows of dots with 4 dots in each row. If the word is spelled correctly, the player can connect two dots. When a square is formed, he can write his initials in the box.



# Dusty Words

Go outside to and write your spellings in dust, sand or mud!

Be sure to clean up afterwards!

## Etch-A-Word

Use an Etch-A-Sketch to write your spelling words.

Read the words to a parent or sibling before erasing.

## Good, Clean Words

Find a countertop or flat surface that can be cleaned easily. Spray a small amount of shaving cream and spread it out. Write your spelling words in the shaving cream. Make sure you clean up afterwards!

# Nopscotch Words

Make a hopscotch board on the pavement or driveway with chalk.

Write letters instead of numbers and HOP your words!

# Letter Writing

Write a friendly letter to a friend or family member using each of your words.
Underline the spelling words that you use in your letter. Maybe you could post it to them.

#### Magazine Words

Use an old magazine and find your words (or the letters that make up your word).

Cut them out and glue on your paper.

# Match-Up

Write each of your words on two different index cards. Turn all the cards face down and mix them up. Lay out your cards in rows (like Concentration) and flip over two cards at a time. Read each card aloud to see it they match. Keep them if they match or flip over and try again!

# sentence, Pleaso

Write sentences using each of your spelling words. You may use more than one word in a sentence, but you must write at least 10 sentences.

<u>Underline</u> your spelling words.

#### Surround Words

Write your words on graph paper. Write "middle" letters, one letter in each box.

Use two boxes for "tall" letters like t and I and "low" letters like j and g. Then outline the words using different colours.



## Spelling Flowers

Draw a picture of a great big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the flower petals or on a leaf. Draw extra flowers if you run out of room.

## Telephone Words

First write your words in a list.
Then look at your telephone keypad.
Translate each letter into the numbers on the keypad. Now write your spelling words using this code!

# Joss a Word

Toss (or roll) a ball back and forth with a partner.

You say the 1<sup>st</sup> letter, and then toss and your partner says 2<sup>nd</sup> letter, and in so forth.

# Type 'Em

Type your spelling words on the computer. *Make each word have a different font.* You could use different colours too.

#### Word Search

Make a word search puzzle using your spelling words.

Use the Discovery School's online Puzzle Maker

Then challenge a friend to find your words!

# Trace Around

Write each of your spelling words using a pencil. Then trace around each word with a crayon, coloured pencil, or a marker.

# Nords Within Words

Write each spelling word and then write at least two words made from the same letters that is hidden inside the word.

Example: slide side lie lid led etc.

# Newsy Words

Use old magazines, catalogues or newspapers to cut out letters.

Glue the letters down on a piece of paper to spell your words.

#### Other Handed

First write your spelling words the way you usually do it.

Then, try writing the list with your other hand! It is more challenging than you think.

# Pasta Words

Arrange alphabet pasta or spaghetti to form your spelling words. Then you can eat them! Delicious!

# Practice Tesx

Take a practice test. Someone in your family can ask you to spell your spelling words. Write them on a list. Check your practice test and correct any missed words. This would be an especially good activity to complete before your test.

# Sound Words

Use a recorder on a mobile phone to record your spelling words and their spelling. Then rewind your tape and listen to it, checking to see that you spelled all the words correctly.

## Teach a pet to spell

Read or sing your spellings to a pet. It will help your spellings and theirs! Woof woof!

#### Words Without Consonants

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the consonants with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing consonants.

# spelling Bee

Practice your spelling words in Spelling Bee style.

Spell your words out loud to a parent or sibling.

#### Words Without Vowe*ls*

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the vowels with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing vowels.

# Spelling Flashcards

Make a set of flashcards to practice your spelling words. When you look at your flashcard, read the word and then spell it out loud.

\*Example- there t-h-e-r-e.

## Make Some Music

Write a song or rap that includes your words!

Share with a friend or family member.

## Morse Code

Use Morse Code to spell your words.

It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site,

to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practice!

# scrabble

Use Scrabble tiles to spell out your spelling words.

For a little extra maths practice, figure out the point value of each of your words!

# Flash Writing

In a darkened room, use a torch to write your spelling words in the air.

Have a partner read your words as you write them or your partner can "flash write" the words and your job is to read.

### Delicious Words

Use cutlery to carefully spell out your spellings in food. Maybe you could write your spellings in baked beans or in mashed potato. Make sure you don't use your fingers!
