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What is a question mark?



A question mark is a punctuation symbol that is used to mark the end of a sentence when asking a question. (Note tone of voice when asking a question and responding – a question needs a relevant response)

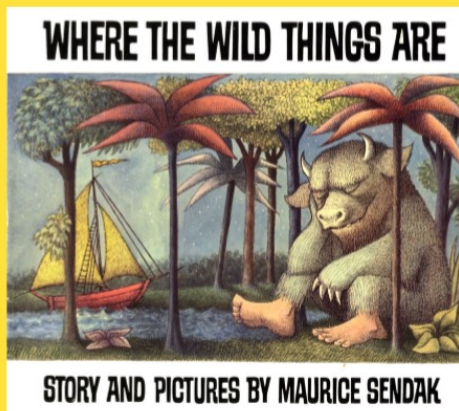

WALT: Use adjectives to describe.

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Can you remember what
an adjective is?



An adjective is a word that describes a noun (a person, place or thing) or complements a verb (a doing or being word).

For example: The **huge** wild thing had **sharp** teeth and **bright yellow** eyes.

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Why would you use an adjective?



To give more detail. It makes your writing more interesting to read - can you spot any?.
