Year 1 National Phonics Screening Check

During the week beginning 12th June our Year 1 children, and any Year 2's who did not pass in Year 1, will participate in the national phonics screening check. This check will be carried out by a member of the Year 1/2 team. Last year we had an incredible 95% pass the check placing our school in the top 20% nationally and we would love to be up there again this year, especially as we know how hard the children have been working each day in their phonic lessons.
