## What Has Happened This Term?

Children have settled well in all three Year 1 and 2 classes, they have quickly responded to new routines and are getting much better at remembering to take their wallets, homework and reading books out of their bags!

In the first week of term the children focused on the British Values, learning about the rule of law, respect, individual liberty, democracy and tolerance. After voting for the class representatives the children were excited to find out who had achieved the different roles.

Our children have also started to earn lots of Dojo points- the most exciting moment was when their eggs hatched into Dojo creatures! They are really enjoying earning points and trying to improve themselves. We hope to share more information about Dojo points in a future whole school newsletter- so keep a watch out for that!

In English the children loved decorating gingerbread men as a 'hook' to set the scene for their Gingerbread stories. Language development is fantastic- Ask your child to describe the fox- see if they can give you three different words.

A highlight for all the children across school has been #HelloYellow day, where our children heard the story of `The butterfly who flew in the rain' and created butterflies to share their hopes and dreams for the future. If you get chance to read it yourself it is worth a look. The children really enjoyed thinking about the key message and developing their understanding of the importance of mental health.

Speaking of mental health, each week have a class Thrive session which is focused on supporting and developing children's emotional wellbeing. This term we have focused on the three parts of the brain- ask your child about the Little Meerkat, Small Elephant and Mini Monkey and they will share their knowledge with you. Learning how to calm when they feel a sense of panic has been of great help- see if they can share their top tips with you.

During the final week of Autumn 1 phonics assessments are being carried out and used to support the decisions around your child's reading book and support they may need. It is really important that by the time reading books come home, your child should be reading totally fluently, using expression and showing a good level of comprehension. If your child is still sounding and blending then it is important to let us know as it may mean they may need to revisit an earlier reading level. ## Read a Rainbow

Once your child has read 25 times at home they will have completed their bookmark caterpillar. Once they hand this in to their class teacher they will receive their certificate and the next rainbow coloured bookmark. This continues until they have 'read a rainbow' and they will receive their end of rainbow prize. We are pleased to say quite a few children in all three classes have made an excellent start with this and are onto their orange bookmarks. Please help to support your child by hearing them read daily, just for 5 minutes as this will mean so much to them and will help them not only to read the rainbow, but also to develop those important reading skills.

#### **Nessy and Numbots**

If your child has been given Nessy login, it is imperative that they do not have help when completing the activities. The program is designed to work with your child- so for example if they find an activity challenging the program will share some other key materials with them. It records where they are learning. If a parent/ older sibling completes any aspects of the activities the program will think the child has the learning completed and move on to the next level- thus making it harder and harder for the child. It is fine to help them navigate the site- showing them how to click on a mouse, or how to us a touch screen, but not how to spell words.

The same can be said for all children using Numbots- please help your child with the site navigation, but not in answering the Mathematical questions. Setting aside 15 minutes every couple of days could really help your child with their Mental Maths. During our Celebration Worship we always celebrate the top three children- so you never know, your child may achieve this. Thank you for your continued support.
