Curriculum Overview

Vision Statement	<p>At Scargill we believe that the learning of a language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for our pupils. It helps them to develop communication skills, including key skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing through real life situations. Lessons are taught in a fun way, often including games and songs; to help all learners remember and use the grammar and vocabulary in different contexts. Our teaching provides the foundations for learning further languages. The children's knowledge of how language works will be developed and extended. Lessons will enable pupils to make substantial progress in one language. The linguistic skills gained will assist and lay foundations for further language learning. It will provide pupils with the confidence and independence to explore and be able to attempt manipulation of the structure of language.</p> <p>Learners develop a curiosity of learning about the wider world; welcoming and celebrating different languages and cultures. By introducing and exposing our children to a knowledge rich curriculum they will have deepened ability to show respect and play a valuable part in our global society through gaining a broader perspective on the world, encouraging them to understand their own cultures and those of others. National Curriculum Objectives	<p>Pupils should be taught to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.• Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.• Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others; seek clarification and help.• Speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures.• Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases.• Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences.• Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.• Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.• Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.• Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing.
